🥟 Measles Update — Brantford, Ontario

• Outbreak & Exposure Sites

Grand Erie Public Health has confirmed multiple measles exposures locally, including Brantford General Hospital (ER & Labour & Delivery), Conklin Medical Centre, TK Liquidation, and Starbucks on Colborne St W. Exposure periods were in late May and early June—monitor until mid-June if vulnerable.

• Province-wide Situation Ontario has recorded 2,115 measles cases (confirmed + probable) between January 1 and June 10, 2025. Of these:

- \circ ~7% required hospitalization (mostly children)
- $\circ \quad 0.4\% \ had \ ICU \ stays$
- There was one infant death—a congenital case
- o All 2,009 cases in Ontario are linked to the current outbreak
- Recommendations for LTC Settings
 - *Vaccination:* Confirm two MMR doses for all staff/residents, especially infants and pregnant individuals.
 - Awareness: Be alert for symptoms up to 21 days following possible exposure.
 - *Reporting:* Any febrile rash should be immediately reported to public health.

West Nile Virus (WNV)

• Seasonal Surveillance

Ontario's Vector-Borne Disease Tool is updated weekly during mosquito season (May–October) and tracks human WNV cases, positive mosquito pools, and tick-related diseases

- Prevention & Risk Management
 - Use DEET/Picaridin repellents during dawn and dusk when mosquitoes are most active <u>hkpr.on.ca</u>.
 - Eliminate standing water (e.g., planters, bird baths).
 - Install/repair screens on windows and doors.

Local Context

While Brant County hasn't recently reported local human WNV cases, benchmarking against provincial surveillance and applying general prevention protocols is advisable.
